MEDICAL CORNER

Has your dog always had soft to lose stools for as long as you can remember?

- 1. Take a stool sample into your vet to ensure no parasites and bacteria
- IF POSITIVE treat with medication from your vet. (a.k.a. Metronidazole, panacur, etc)
 -IF NEGATIVE go to step 2
- 2. Change your dog's diet over to Science Diet Light dry kibble. Just try it please. No need to transition, just switch cold turkey. More than half

of the people I consult with on this topic find this diet change in less than two weeks has changed the outcome of the stool to be formed AND firm which is how stools should be.

Bostons are prone to having colitis. This is the one dog food on the market (no prescription needed) that I have found to work for all cases. There is no test to confirm colitis other than treat the symptoms with the diet change and if the stool is better you have your answer.

Some cases have gone for so long without properly being addressed that predisone is needed to help reduce the inflammation of the intestines. Just imagine how angry the dog's insides are from have basically diarrhea to soft stools for so long? This medication would need to be purchased at your vet clinic and would only be for three weeks.

Consequences of soft/loose stools is issues with anal glands getting impacted AND/OR straining results in a prolapsed rectum.

Impacted anal glands are painful and not healthy for your dog. Firm stools express anal glands every time your dog goes poop, otherwise the fluid in the anal glands stores up, hardens and now requires medical attention.

A prolapsed rectum can result in emergency surgery.

The Weather is Getting COOOOLLD Again...

We know that the routine is we potty outside and not in our living space. There are ways to maintain this routine when temperatures are freezing and/or snow is taller than our dogs.

*DO NOT FORCE YOUR DOG TO STAY OUTSIDE IF HE WANTS IN. YOU ARE NOT HELPING THE SITUATION OTHER THAN MAKING THEM COLDER and NOT WANTING TO EVER GO OUT AGAIN!

Tips:

- 1. Go outside with your dog for his potty break.
- 2. Get your dog a sweater and booties if he will wear them. Even if he will only wears clothing for outside.

- 3. If your dog does not go potty on the first break and wants in, bring him back in the house but stand by the door to allow him to warm up for two minutes and then return back outside to finish. This will let him know what the required routine is at that time.
- 4. Do not force your dog to pee and poop on the same trip outside. He may need to make multiple trips in order not to freeze.
- 5. Praise your dog when he potties outside for you. Again you are there with a treat in your hand standing next to him.
- 6. Make the experience being outside in the cold fun. (i.e. you run around the yard, throw a stick or snowball).
- 7. When your dog comes back inside wipe down their feet of any moisture or snow.
- 8. Create a fun experience inside when he potties outside for you (i.e. cuddle time in a warm blanket with mom, cozy bed ready in front of the fireplace)

Thinking out of the box options:

- 1. If you have snow on the ground shovel a trail for your dog. Why should they have to walk on snow?
- 2. Place tarp around your deck creating a barrier for the wind.
- 3. A garage is considered a space outside of the living area. This can be considered an option other than outside. Poop is easy to pick up. Wipe up the pee and then place hot water over the area. You can power wash the garage in the summer. Other options is laying down newspaper or puppy pads in the garage.

Sweater recommendation:

Signs your dog may do good with a sweater in the cold:

- shivering and shaking
- inside of the ears are very cold to the touch
- · lifts paws off the cold ground
- reluctant to keep walking or turns around on a walk
- · seeks warm shelter such as under the covers

MABTR loves the stretch fleece as they

- fit snug on the dog
- comfortable enough to keep on while indoors
- no fuzz balls
- no tightness to the underarms
- no loose material under the belly; other sweaters get hit by urine
- · easy to wash

*Owners with outdoor pets: please reconsider finding a space in your home to allow these pets indoors when temperatures are freezing.

MABTR Alumni - Kobe

This is Kobe. I adopted him in late April 2011, from MABTR. He was a hard luck story ... found as a stray after being hit by a car. MABTR took him in, got his fractured back leg fixed, which needed several pins in order to heal. He is also deaf, which may be why he got hit. I live in Idaho, and Kobe was coming from Iowa, via a



kind hearted trucker who was passing thru on his way to Washington state. We met him along the freeway at a truck stop and



got Kobe, and took him home where he fit right in with his new brother Booker, (a Boston terrier the same age) and Lainey, his older sister (half Boston and half English bulldog, also deaf). Lainey passed away several years ago, but Kobe and Booker remain inseparable to this day.

Kobe had some problems with rejecting his internal hardware in his leg in 2012, while we were in NY helping my mom with Parkinson's Disease. Finding help for him was difficult, and eventually infection became too out of control and I had to have Kobe's leg removed. He has done well and gets along very well. He is about 10 years old now and moves a little slower but is still doing well. He is my guardian and my protector, and I love him and his brother with all my heart. MABTR turns 15 years old, Saving 4000+ lives

MidAmerica Boston Terrier Rescue celebrates 15 years of service and over 4000 dogs saved in 2020

In November 2005 MidAmerica Boston Terrier Rescue officially opened their doors as a 501c3 non-profit organization taking in bostons and boston mixes that needed to be rehomed. Our services spread across only four states at the time but very quickly expanded across 13 states as our foster homes and volunteer base grew. We remain a foster based rehoming program and added a Palliative Care program in 2011.

The concept and start-up of MABTR may have been the initiative of one person however a family was immediately created with individuals that had a common mission resulting in the success that MABTR is today.

To date we have taken in 4,090 bostons and boston mixes. We have rehomed the majority of them. However, over the years 62 entered Palliative Care and unfortunately 42 were sent in peace while in foster care.

MABTR is very blessed with all the support they have received over the years from foster parents, donors, transporters, vet clinic discounts/services, and volunteers. We thank you for your past, present, and future support. No matter how big or small the donation, the frequency of volunteer hours, or just verbal support know you have played a role in helping MABTR make a positive change in the lives of so many rescued bostons.

We will always strive to run the best organization in order to help as many bostons that come our way no matter age, gender, or health. We pride ourselves on our response time, professional and open communication, full disclosure policy, all boston lives matter philosophy, and prioritizing our efforts to save as many bostons from puppy mills as possible.


